£2.4 Million Lotto Jackpot Remains Unclaimed In Kensington And Chelsea

Somebody who may already live in the most expensive borough in the UK, Kensington and Chelsea, could soon be living like a king on the King's Road – if only they come forward in time to claim an amazing Lotto jackpot prize of **£2,403,495** which remains unclaimed in the area.

The search is now on to find the owner of the winning ticket, which was bought in the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea, who matched all six numbers in the Lotto draw on Saturday 17 March 2007. The National Lottery® is urging players to check and double-check their tickets for the chance to claim this life-changing prize. The winning numbers on that date were: 1, 9, 14, 20, 43 and 44. The lucky ticket-holder has until 5.30pm on Thursday 13 September 2007 to come forward and make their claim.

With £2.4 million in the bank, the missing ticket-holder could buy a luxury apartment at the exclusive Chelsea Harbour for £835,000 and still have enough money left to keep up with celebrity neighbours like Nigella Lawson, David Frost, Hugh Grant and Joan Collins. With their change, the mystery winner could regularly do their shopping at Harvey Nichols, or simply enjoy some serious retail therapy or just 'being seen' on the fashionable King's Road

Although not quite in the same league as Chelsea's Micheal Ballack – who reportedly earns £8.7 million a year – Kensington and Chelsea's unknown millionaire would also have more than enough to make watching the match a real luxury. When it comes to treating friends and family to a day at Stamford Bridge, hospitality packages for a three course meal and match tickets start from £650.

To jog Lotto players’ memories, on 17 March 2007, *Premonition* starring Sandra Bullock was showing at cinemas across the country – while *Take That* were topping the charts with *Shine*. Closer to home audiences at the Finborough Theatre were enjoying a production of *Love Child*, while Chelsea fans were celebrating a 3-0 win at home to Sheffield United.

With all National Lottery draws, players have 180 days from the day of the draw to claim their prize if they have the winning ticket. Anyone who believes they have the winning ticket for any of the National Lottery draws within the 180-day deadline should call the **National Lottery Line** on **0845 910 0000**.

If no-one comes forward with the winning ticket before the prize claim deadline, then the prize money, plus all the interest it has generated, will go to the Good Causes – adding to the £20 billion already raised through sales of lottery tickets since The National Lottery® launched in November 1994.
